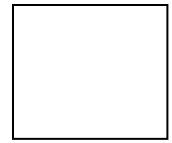

SLIDE 1 – Destination Panama City invites you to the highly anticipated City of Panama City "Salute to Freedom" 4th of July event! TRANSITION TO SLIDE 2 – The Public Works Department, Quality of Life Department, and independent contractors have been hard at work for the re-opening of the t-dock at the Panama City Marina. The re-opening is scheduled for July 4th, in time to allow viewing of the spectacular fireworks display during the Salute to Freedom event. The t-dock is undergoing repairs that include new irrigation and sod for a beautiful greenspace, a natural pathway, a four-foot perimeter

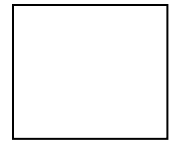


fence, solar lighting, and a driveway to access the end of the t-dock for fishing. It will remain open for public use.

TRANSITION TO SLIDE 3 – A new mural celebrating the history of the Historic St. Andrews district will be unveiled on Saturday, June 15th at 10am at Oaks by the Bay Park. The mural is painted by local artist Sara Gramlich. It is painted on the ground around Old Sentry Tree, an approximately 250-year-old oak tree that is one of the oldest and most beloved landmarks in the district. The mural features scenes from Native American times, local fishing, the Governor’s Stone, a survey map from 1855, the old train depot, Hurricane Michael, and Ware’s Wharf.

The mural was made possible by a grant from the Florida Department of State, Division of Arts and Culture, and the City of Panama City. We encourage everyone to come out and see this mural. It is a wonderful addition to our community and a reminder of the special place that is Historic St. Andrews.

TRANSITION TO SLIDE 4 –The City of Panama City is inviting kids ages 2-6 to come celebrate Shark Week at the St Andrews Marina Shark & Seek Event on July 13 from 2-3pm! Kids will have the chance



to participate in a fun-filled scavenger hunt, create shark-themed arts and crafts, play exciting shark games, enjoy snacks and more!
