

The Panama City Community Redevelopment Agency is committed to the revitalization of our city's four designated districts. The Panama City CRA's District Plans were adopted in 1984 and last amended in 2018, respectively. The District Plans identify Overall Needs* within the Districts. - Develop Incentive Programs
- Affordable Housing
